

# A Monet in Murwillumbah: Sharing the National Collection 1 November 2023 - 26 October 2025

<u>Sensational!</u> This work of art is on long-term loan from the National Gallery of Australia with support from the Australian Government as part of Sharing the National Collection.

Between 1890 and 1891, Monet painted his Haystacks series exploring the nuances of light, shade, tone and colour across the seasons and at different times of the day. *Meules, milieu du jour [Haystacks, midday]* 1890 is a glorious work from this series, filled with dazzling light and luminous colour.

Claude Monet's *Meules, milieu du jour [Haystacks, midday]* 1890, was purchased in 1979 by the National Gallery of Australia, and is the first of five works to be shared with the Tweed Regional Gallery. The remaining works – three by iconic Australian artist Margaret Olley as well as *Natura morta [Still life]* 1956 by Giorgio Morandi – will be shared with the Tweed from February 2024.

The Gallery is open Wednesday to Sunday 10 am – 5 pm (DST) free of charge, and Apex Dining is open Wednesday to Sunday from 9 am to 4 pm. Imagine MONET for free!

#### National Immunisation Program Changes to **SHINGLES VACCINATION** from 1 November 2023

The shingles vaccine Shingrix® will replace Zostavax® on the National Immunisation Program (NIP) for eligible people.

Who can get the free vaccine? A 2-dose course of Shingrix® will be available free for:

- people aged 65 years and over
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged 50 years and over, and
- immunocompromised people aged 18 years

What is shingles? Shingles is a viral infection that causes a painful blistering rash. It is caused by reactivation of the same virus that causes chickenpox. While most symptoms typically last 2-3 weeks, shingles can become serious. It can lead to nerve pain that can last for months (called post-herpetic neuralgia or PHN). Other serious complications include pneumonia, hearing problems, blindness and swelling of the brain.

About 1 in 3 people will get shingles in their lifetime.

- <u>Just when you thought it had gone away.</u> Over the last week, 5,300 cases of <u>COVID-19</u> were reported across Australia, an average of 757 cases per day, NSW 221 per day, up 15.2 % on previous week.
- Over 68.8 million total vaccine doses have been administered in Australia, since the COVID-19 Vaccination program began in February 2021.
- Approximately 31,000 doses have been administered over the last 7 days.
