BRENDA'S Cheddar & curry biscuits Use exact measurements

1 cup (150g) plain flour 2 tablespoons self-raising flour ¹⁄₄ teaspoon cayenne pepper (or curry powder) 1 cup (125g) grated tasty cheddar cheese 125g butter, chopped 1 tablespoon water, approx.

Sift dry ingredients into medium bowl, rub in butter Stir in cheese and enough water to make a soft dough Knead gently on lightly floured surface, until smooth Shape dough into a 38cm sausage shape, wrap tightly in foil, refrigerate 1 hour (Or roll flat to 5mm, to cut straws 5mm x 50mm)

Cut roll into 5mm thick slices, place 3cm apart on greased oven travs

Bake in moderate oven about 25 min till lightly browned. Cool before lifting off trays

Makes approx. 70
